- More than 50,000 receive a benefit from TRS
- About \$166 million monthly in pension payments



The average benefit is about \$3,200 a month







TRS Medical Insurance Funded Status





Retired teachers have significant economic impact in every **Kentucky** county

- TRS pays:
 - \$166 million in retirement annuity benefits (*July 2017*)
 - \$24 million in medical benefits (monthly average)
- 89% of TRS retirees live in Kentucky
- Retired teachers would make TRS the secondlargest employer in many counties
- About \$1.8 billion a year paid into Kentucky's economy because of pension benefits


Retired Teachers Impact Across Kentucky



Fiscal Year 2017: 2,151 Service Retirements




- Less than 5% retire before age 50







- TRS has fiduciary duty in procurement.
- Fees disclosed in annual report and quarterly on website.
- Structure is recommended as a "best practice" for other pension systems.





More Did You Know?

- 58% of retired teachers received \$40,000 or less in Fiscal Year 2017.
- 90% of retirees receive \$60,000 or less
- Fewer than 1% of retirees (0.8%) receive more than \$100,000
- TRS replaces Social Security
- Retirees receiving between \$20,000 and \$40,000 worked an average of 27 years.
- People receiving higher pensions also worked longer




